**Ni-shoku** means the second school cafeteria. “Ni” means second, and “shoku” is the abbreviated phrase “shokudo(means cafeteria)” as “shoku”. 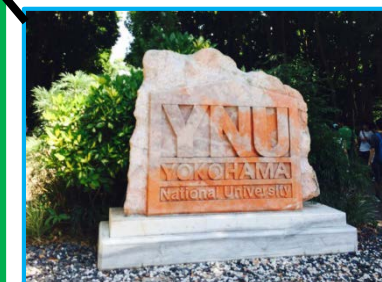
**The Central Library**, located at the center of Tokiwadai campus, is the biggest library at YNU. Collections feature 760,000 print volumes, which includes researches and books published by YNU professors and students. Also, there is a café on the first floor.



**Yaon** means open-air concert hall in Japanese. There was a circular water fountain at the middle of Yaon. However, the fountain was removed and the site is used as the main stage during the university festival. It is a nice place to have lunch.



**Economics Department Buildings**, the 8-storey building is the main office of Graduate School of International Social Sciences (GSISS). It is the research hub of economics and law students who belong to English-graduate program. Besides self-study rooms, class-rooms, there is also spaces for students to relax and discuss their research ideas from which the view of beautiful center of Yokohama is spotted.



**YNU Monument**, the 7-ton monument is a gift from central coast of Vietnam as a symbol for close partnership between YNU and Danang University (central Vietnam). The monument is also marked continuous effort of YNU to bring its name to the world outside Japan.
